OBSERVATION WELL REPORT: Dave Ford presented the Irrigated Area Observation Wells Change in Readings report reflecting a one year and ten year comparison of well measurements. Of the 123 observation wells compared from 2013 to 2014, 73.2% showed a 1.59 foot average decline and 13.8% showed a 3.97 foot average decline. The 10 year comparison indicated the largest declines were in eastern Phelps County and western and central Kearney County. Ford also compared the spring data from 1981-1985 to 2014. He also presented Observation Well Hydrographs reflecting historical data from five random wells in the core irrigated area.

<u>WATER SERVICE AGREEMENT (ELWOOD RESERVOIR) – NEBRASKA DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND TRI-BASIN NATURAL RESOURCES DISTRICT: This was discussed in Closed Session.</u>

<u>J-2 REGULATING RESERVOIR</u>: Mike Drain reported he and Cory Steinke recently met with the State Historical Society at the J-2 site and they met with the Dawson and Phelps County Roads Departments last week. More discussions were held in Closed Session.

<u>PERSONNEL</u>: There were two additions to payroll for two new Habitat Area Technicians at Lake McConaughy.

<u>LEGISLATION</u>: Jeff Buettner reported on his recent participation in a conference call regarding the interim study bill for the Natural Resources Districts' standing before the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources. Don Kraus stated he will begin orientation this week for his recent appointment to the Natural Resources Commission and they will have their first meeting on June 18-19, 2014.

<u>DIRECTORS' ATTENDANCE</u>: All Directors were present.

<u>BOARD COMMENTS</u>: Director Nelson observed flood conditions at Laramie, Wyoming over the weekend. Director Mueller stated the South Platte is very full at Ogallala as of last week.

<u>OPERATIONS REPORT</u>: The following operations reports were presented:

- a. Kevin Boyd stated the reservoirs and canal is full and flows are very good. The gates have been painted at the diversion dam. He received notification from the Bureau of Reclamation that Lake McConaughy will receive its full Glendo allotment.
- b. Jeff Buettner stated the recent UNL tour with international students, mostly from Africa, was successful and the students were very inquisitive. He conducted a tour last week with students from UNK.
- c. Dave Ford announced the irrigation delivery schedule will begin on June 9, 2014. He has concerns about canal capacity and the ability to divert to Elwood Reservoir.
- d. Holly Rahmann stated the website is going well and she is currently working with staff on ideas for the blog. She will attend a social media training in Omaha this week. She plans to meet with Directors following the meeting who are interested in training and giving input on the board website.
- e. Don Kraus stated John Berge from North Platte Natural Resources District is presenting the Western Users Model at the next COHYST meeting on June 25, 2014. Kraus will report more to the Board at the June 27, 2014 Committee of the Board meeting.
- f. Cory Steinke reported that Lake McConaughy's elevation is at 3,240.3, 1,100,000 acre feet and 63% capacity, which is an increase of 1.1 feet from last week. The canal companies started taking their Glendo storage water annual allotments over the weekend pursuant to their water service agreements. He stated that 2,500 cfs is coming into Lake McConaughy and 600 cfs is being released. The South Platte flows continue to increase and snowpack is still good. He predicts around 3,400 cfs to be flowing through Overton within the next few days.

A break was taken at 9:50 a.m. The meeting resumed at 10:00 a.m.

At 10:01 AM it was moved by Director Knoerzer, seconded by Director Mueller, that the Board go into Closed Session to discuss legal matters. Upon voting on the motion, the following Directors voted therefore: Garrett, Knoerzer, Mueller, Nelson, R. Olson, S. Olson, Petersen, Rowe, Soneson, Bogle, Dahlgren, and Fowler. None voted no and the motion was declared carried. WATER SERVICE AGREEMENT (ELWOOD RESERVOIR) – NEBRASKA DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND TRI-BASIN NATURAL RESOURCES DISTRICT: It was moved by Director Rowe, seconded by Director Garrett, that the Board approve the Water Service Agreement-Groundwater Recharge From Excess Flows Between The Central Nebraska Public Power and Irrigation District, Nebraska Department of Natural Resources and Tri-Basin Natural Resources District, subject to legal review. Upon voting on the motion, the following Directors voted therefore: Knoerzer, Mueller, Nelson, R. Olson, S. Olson, Petersen, Rowe, Soneson, Bogle, Dahlgren, Fowler, and Garrett. None voted no and the motion was declared carried.
