<u>PUBLIC INPUT</u>: Allan McClure presented a letter formally requesting financial records relating to the income and expenses at Johnson Lake. Linda Aust presented a letter which outlines demographic information of Sandy Point residents and the costs residents have spent to maintain their land and shorelines. Phyllis Byrns and Rod Schmidt both addressed the Board about increasing property values, taxes and expenses related to the upkeep of their properties. Jim Brown explained the budget amendment for the Bossung Lake Study is needed because he intends to present a contract with JEO Consulting next month for the feasibility study.

It was moved by Director Mueller and seconded by Director Soneson to approve the Hydro Division Budget Revision #8 as presented. Upon voting on the motion, the following Directors voted therefore: Bogle, Dahlgren, Fowler, Garrett, Knoerzer, Mueller, Nelson, R. Olson, S. Olson, Petersen, Rowe, and Soneson. None voted no and the motion was declared carried.

<u>CONTRACT FOR FERC PART 12 CONSULTANT</u>: Mike Drain explained he sought bids for the Part 12D dam safety inspections of the Kingsley Dam and the Supply Canal facilities (including an inspection of Elwood Reservoir) from three consultants, but Mead & Hunt was the only consultant to submit a proposal in an amount of \$82,900. The final report must be provided no later than November 25, 2017.

It was moved by Director S. Olson and seconded by Director Petersen to approve Mead & Hunt's proposal in the amount of \$82,900 for the FERC Part 12 Safety Inspection. Upon voting on the motion, the following Directors voted therefore: Bogle, Dahlgren, Fowler, Garrett, Knoerzer, Mueller, Nelson, R. Olson, S. Olson, Petersen, Rowe, and Soneson. None voted no and the motion was declared carried. <u>SRS CRISAFULLI INVOICE FOR DREDGE (\$43,135.00)</u>: Kevin Boyd presented recent photos of the sediment as a result of dredging. He recommends renting the dredge an additional month until August 10, 2016 to test the dredge in the Supply Canal and Diversion Dam. The fee to rent the dredge an additional month is \$43,135.00.

It was moved by Director Soneson and seconded by Director Garrett to approve payment to SRS Crisafulli in the amount of \$43,135.00. Upon voting on the motion, the following Directors voted therefore: Bogle, Dahlgren, Fowler, Garrett, Knoerzer, Mueller, Nelson, R. Olson, S. Olson, Petersen, Rowe, and Soneson. None voted no and the motion was declared carried.

<u>WATER SUSTAINABILITY FUND APPLICATION</u>: Don Kraus requested Board approval to allow Central staff to prepare an application to use Water Sustainability Funds for the J-2 Regulating Reservoir Project (Project). The funding would supplement Central's contribution for the Project which has been reduced due to a smaller benefit to Central. After preparation of the application, he would present the application to the Board for consideration at a Special Meeting on July 22, 2016 to submit the application by the July 31, 2016 deadline.

It was moved by Director S. Olson and seconded by Director Fowler to authorize staff to prepare an application to the Water Sustainability Fund for the J-2 Regulating Reservoir Project (Project). Director Bogle expressed concerns about staff time to prepare the application and the use of taxpayer dollars for the Project. Upon voting on the motion, the following Directors voted therefore: Fowler, Garrett, Knoerzer, Mueller, Nelson, R. Olson, S. Olson, Petersen, Rowe, and Soneson. Bogle and Dahlgren voted no. The motion was declared carried.

<u>J-2 REGULATING RESERVOIR</u>: There was nothing new to report.

<u>PERSONNEL</u>: There were no personnel actions to report.

<u>LEGISLATION</u>: Jeff Buettner had nothing new to report.

<u>DIRECTORS' ATTENDANCE</u>: All Directors were in attendance.

<u>BOARD COMMENTS</u>: Director Dahlgren stated he is against using taxpayer funds through the Water Sustainability Fund for the J-2 Regulating Reservoir.

<u>OPERATIONS REPORT</u>: The following operations reports were presented:

- a. Jeff Buettner is attending an NSIA meeting next week, conducting tours this week and continues to make plans for the 75th Anniversary of Kingsley Dam.
- b. Rochelle Jurgens reported that all irrigation accounts have been paid. She sent delinquent notices on 13 accounts at Johnson Lake and 5 at Lake McConaughy.
- c. Cory Steinke reported that Lake McConaughy's elevation is at 3,263.9, 98.1% of capacity and 1,706,500 acre feet. Inflows are around 3,500 cfs and outflows are 2,800 cfs. There is 1,084 cfs in the North Platte at Lewellen and 485 cfs in the South Platte at Roscoe. He is operating at full power generation and irrigation mode.
- d. Dave Ford stated the third irrigation run began yesterday. The Phelps Canal is running at 600 cfs and the E65 Canal is at 260 cfs. He reported Don Kraus will meet soon with Jerry Kenny to discuss whether the Platte Program is interested in continuing with the Water Leasing Program.
- e. Don Kraus stated Emily Anderson will contact Administration Committee and Power and Recreation Committee members to arrange meetings this month.

The meeting adjourned at 9:42 AM.
